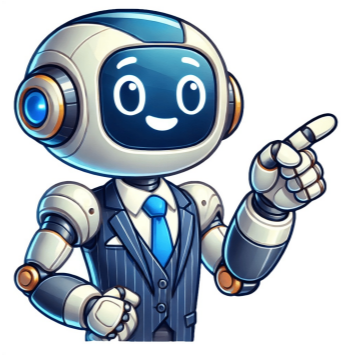

Vasco Rossi is a renowned Italian singer-songwriter and poet born on February 7, 1952, in Zocca, Italy. Known for his provocative style, he has published 30 albums and written over 250 songs, including lyrics for other artists. With a career spanning decades, Rossi has been criticized for his lifestyle and song lyrics but has maintained a massive following with over 35 million copies sold worldwide. His Modena Park 2017 concert holds the record for the highest-attended ticketed concert in history. Born to Carlo and Novella Rossi, Vasco developed an interest in music at a young age and began playing in his first band at 14. He moved to Bologna with his family and studied accounting while working as a DJ and co-founding a private radio station to showcase his talents. Encouraged by friend Gaetano Curreri, Rossi released his debut EP in 1977 and went on to release several albums, including the controversial "Colpa d'Alfredo" in 1980, which sparked both criticism and increased popularity. His rise to fame was solidified after a live performance on Italian television program *Domenica In*, followed by the release of his album "Siamo solo noi" in 1981. The title track, a signature song for Vasco Rossi, became an iconic hymn across generations. In 1982, he participated in the Sanremo Music Festival, performing "Vado al massimo" ("I'm taking it to the max"). Although he received harsh criticism and finished last, this marked his first appearance at the festival. The following year, he returned with "Vita spericolata" (Daredevil Life), finishing in second-to-last place due to his apparent intoxication. Rossi's album *Bollicine* ("Little Bubbles"), released in 1983, was his sixth in seven years and solidified him as an icon of Italian rock. The title track won the Festivalbar '83, and his tour that year was extremely successful. To celebrate this period, he released his first live recording, *Va bene, va bene cos* ("It's alright, it's alright this way"), in 1984. However, April brought a setback: he was arrested for drug possession and subsequently sentenced to two years and eight months of probation. His next album, *Cosa succede in città* ("What's going on in the city"), released shortly after, received poor reviews and lacked commercial success. In 1987, Rossi released his ninth studio album, *C' chi dice no* ("There Are Some Who Say No"). The massive fan turnout forced him to stop performing in clubs and move to bigger venues. His tenth studio album, *Liberi liberi* ("[we are] Free, Free"), was released in 1989 and reached 800,000 sales in Italy. The success of his 1989 tour led to the release of the live album *Fronte del palco* (a play on "Stage Front") and two concerts in 1990: one at San Siro stadium in Milan and another at Flaminio in Rome. The live album sold over 300,000 units in Italy. *Gli spari sopra* ("The shots above"), released in 1993, went ten times platinum. In 1994, he gifted the unreleased "Senza Parole" ("Without Words") to his official fan-club members. In 1995, Rossi protested the war in Bosnia and Herzegovina with a double concert, *Rock sotto l'assedio* ("Rock under siege"), featuring Bosnian bands. In 1996, Rossi recorded his new studio album, *Nessun Pericolo... Per Te* ("No Danger... For You"), featuring songs like "Sally" and "Gli angeli" ("The Angels"). The drum track for the song "Anche se" ("Even If") was later called "Praticamente perfetto" ("Practically Perfect") and featured Taylor Hawkins. Vasco Rossi released his album *Nessun Pericolo... Per Te* in 1996, marking a significant moment in his career. Two years later, he shifted towards a softer sound with *Canzoni per me*, which included unreleased songs from the beginning of his career. Despite the change in style, Rossi won his second Festivalbar with the song "L'una per te", a wordplay on "Moon" and "The one". Due to the low compatibility of these songs with his live shows, he limited his performances to a single concert at the Heineken Jammin' Festival in Imola, Italy. This evening was later immortalized in the 1999 live album *Rewind*. Tragedy struck when his friend and guitarist Massimo Riva passed away, and Rossi would go on to honor his memory in subsequent concerts. In 2001, *Stupido Hotel* was released, earning Rossi his third Festivalbar win with "Siamo Soli". The following year, he released *Tracks*, a collection of remastered songs, which was followed by three sold-out shows at San Siro Stadium in Milan. His album *Buoni o cattivi* became the most successful album in Italy in 2004. Rossi received an honorary degree in Communication Sciences from Milan's IULM in 2005 and released the double DVD solo un *Rock'n'Roll* show, introducing the concept of the 'movieclip'. Later that year, he released *Buoni o cattivi live* anthology 04.05, a comprehensive box set featuring live recordings from his record-setting tour. In 2007, he released the "Vasco Extended Play", which topped the Italian FIMI Charts for 21 weeks and became the best-selling single of 2007. Rossi has been vocal about the challenges he faced in gaining international recognition, citing government interference as a major obstacle. In 2010, he released the album *Sono innocente*, preceded by the single "Come vorrei", and collaborated with Dave Grohl on the song "Sognare ancora". Vasco Rossi, the Italian musician, has received various accolades for his contributions to music. In May 2023, he was awarded Rome's highest civilian honor, the Lupa Capitolina, by Mayor Roberto Gualtieri. Rossi announced his retirement from touring and live work in June 2011 but later withdrew his resignation and embarked on new tours, including *Vasco Live Kom '014*, *Vasco Live Kom '015*, and *Vasco Live Kom '016*. His 40th-year concert celebration in Modena Park (2017) broke world records for ticket sales. Rossi is an atheist and has expressed support for anarchism. In 2011, his lawyers threatened to take legal action against a satirical website due to perceived offense, leading to the site's shutdown. Throughout his career, Rossi released numerous albums, including "Ma cosa vuoi che sia una canzone" (1978), "Non siamo mica gli americani" (1979), and "Colpa d'Alfredo" (1980). Some of his notable tracks include "Vado al massimo," "Bollicine," and "Gli spari sopra." His album "Vasco Extended Play" features three new tracks plus one video. He has also released several live albums, including "Live Kom 2011 The complete edition" (2012) and "Tutto in una notte Live Kom 015" (2016). Throughout his career, Vasco Rossi has worked with various musicians on studio recordings. For instance, he collaborated with Taylor Hawkins on the drums for "L'uomo pi semplice" (2013). His songwriting often incorporates elements of Italian culture and society, as seen in tracks like "Manifesto futurista della nuova umanità" (2011) and "La verità" (2018). His recent releases include singles such as "Una canzone d'amore buttata via" (2021), "Siamo qui" (2021), and "L'amore l'amore" (2022). Vasco Rossi's extensive career spans several decades and numerous tours, starting with the *Giorni Simone Tomassini* tour in 2005. He has collaborated with various artists, including Laura Pausini in 2011 and Gu feat. Stadio Buoni o Cattivi Tour in 2004-05. Throughout his career, Vasco Rossi has received numerous awards and nominations, such as the Italian Music Awards for Best Italian Album and Best Italian Male Artist in 2001, as well as the Premio Italiano della Musica Award for *Canzoni per me* Album of the Year in 1999. He was also nominated for MTV Europe Music Awards and won the Premio Tenco Artist Award in 2020. Some notable highlights include his record-breaking Modena Park concert in 2017, which sold over 225,000 tickets, making it the world's largest ticketed concert. Additionally, Vasco Rossi has been recognized with several FIMI Special Awards and Critics' Awards throughout his career.
