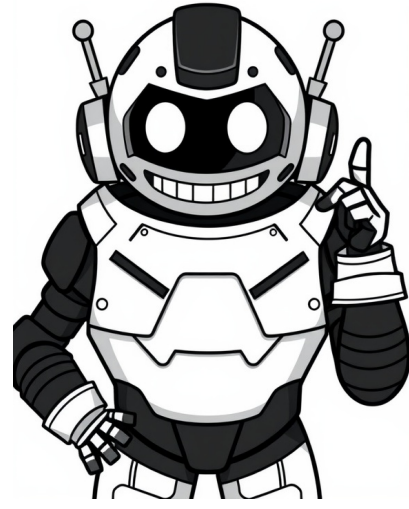

Meanwhile, Gundald, the illegitimate son of Clotaire I, arrived with financial support from Constantinople and claimed the cities of Poitiers and Toulouse as his own. The Visigoths under King Liuvigild captured the city of Mérida in western central Spain, prompting its bishop Masona to be arrested and exiled for three years. The 5th century was marked by significant events across Eurasia. In China, the period of the Sixteen Kingdoms continued, characterized by the formation and collapse of small sub-kingdoms ruled by warring ethnic groups. The Northern Wei dynasty reunited the north of China in 439, while the Jin statesman Liu Yu consolidated his power and forced Emperor Gong of Jin to abdicate in 420, marking the beginning of the (Liu) Song dynasty. In India, the Gupta Empire was invaded from Central Asia and occupied by elements of the Huna peoples. The Huns, who had previously devastated Rome, were also present in Eastern Africa, where they clashed with the Vandals over control of Carthage. This led to a series of military campaigns, including one against Vandal North Africa, which ultimately ended in failure. The 5th century saw the rise and fall of various dynasties across Eurasia. In China, the Northern and Southern dynasties period began with the consolidation of power by Liu Yu. In India, the Gupta Empire faced significant challenges from external invaders. Meanwhile, in Eastern Africa, the Huns clashed with other groups over control of resources. Overall, the 5th century was a time of turmoil and transformation across Eurasia. The collapse of the Western Roman Empire and the rise of new powers marked a significant shift in the balance of power on the continent.
