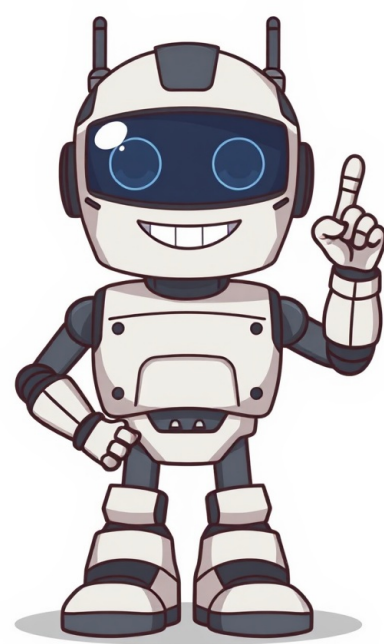

Like Annabelle, the film was shot chronologically. Embracing its based-on-a-true-story roots, The Conjuring became a huge success, earning \$319 million worldwide with a \$20 million budget. Annabelle Comes Home, written and directed by Gary Dauberman, focuses on Judy Warren, daughter of Ed and Lorraine Warren. When the parents leave their house in town, Mary Ellen babysits but is tempted to explore the Warrens' supernatural collection, awakening an evil spirit trapped in a doll - Annabelle.
