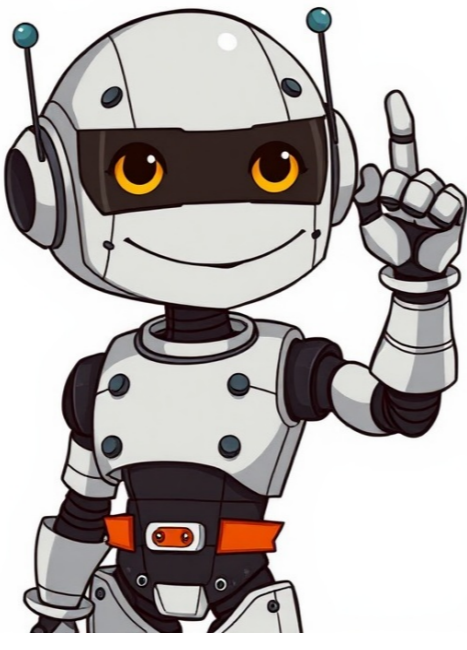


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===== Kaspersky Trial License: What You Need to Know To try out Kaspersky's antivirus software, you can use a trial license or subscription for free. This trial period lasts for 30 days and allows you to explore the features of their applications. However, there are certain restrictions on using a trial license. Firstly, it cannot be used if the user is already utilizing another license or has previously used the application's trial version on the same computer. Additionally, if you have already activated a commercial license, you will not be able to use the trial license. Moreover, if you've exceeded the 30-day trial period, an error message will appear stating that the trial version has expired. In this case, you won't be able to continue using the application until you purchase and activate it with a new license. Many software companies offer a "try-before-you-buy" option to help potential customers test their products before making a purchase. Kaspersky provides a 30-day trial period for its Anti-Virus, net Security, and Pure Total Security software for home computer users. For users of Windows XP and higher, you can extend the trial period by another 30 days until you make a decision on whether or not to purchase their technical support. To reset your trial license, follow these steps: Resetting Your Trial License To start, find out what version of Windows you're using. If it's XP or later, follow these steps: 1. Click the "Start" button at the bottom left corner of your screen. 2. Choose "Settings," then "Control Panel," and "System." 3. Observe your Windows edition and the last two digits when the "x" in your laptop name. If you're using a classic start menu, follow these steps: 1. Click "Start," then "Control Panel," "Performance or System and Maintenance," and "System." 2. Find your Windows edition and the last two digits of your laptop name. 3. Delete the expired license from the Kaspersky license link. Now, to reset the trial license: Disconnect from the internet, open your Kaspersky security program, and click on the "License" link at the bottom. Delete the expired license and close the window. Next, go to the "Settings" section in the high right corner and uncheck "Enable Self-Defense." Click "Apply" and "OK." Shut down the Kaspersky window, then right-click the Kaspersky icon at the bottom right of the screen and click on "Exit." Click the "Start" button again and open the Run dialog. Type "regedit" in the "Open" field and click on "OK." Follow these paths to reset your trial license: For Windows with the last two digits 86: Computer\HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\KasperskyLab\protected\AVP11\environment. For Windows with the last two digits 64: Computer\HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Wow6432Node\KasperskyLab\protected\AVP11\environment. To complete the process, double-click on "PCID" in the right-hand column below "Name." Replace the last four characters before the bracket with any combination of uppercase character set characters and click "OK." Shut down the registry editor window and reconnect to the internet. Open Kaspersky and choose the "Activate trial version" button. Follow the prompts to complete the activation process. Once activated, you can use Kaspersky's antivirus software without any limitations during the remaining 29 days of your trial period. ===== To continue using Kaspersky after the trial period ends, follow these steps: Click "Finish" and then double-click the Kaspersky icon to open it. If you see thirty days remaining on your license, proceed as usual. If not, call their customer service at 1-855-205-0915 for assistance. Many software companies offer a free trial period to let users test their products before buying. Kaspersky provides a 30-day trial for its Anti-Virus, Internet Security, and Pure Total Security software. Windows XP users can extend this trial by another 30 days if needed. Before resetting your trial, identify the edition of Windows you're using: click "Start" > "Settings" > "Control Panel" > "System." Note the Windows edition and the last two digits after the "x" in your computer name. To reset Kaspersky's trial period, follow these steps: disconnect from the internet, open the security program, delete the expired license, and click "Close". Then, go to "Settings" > "Self-Defense", uncheck "Enable Self-Defense", and click "Apply" and "OK". Close Kaspersky, right-click its icon in the system tray, and click "Exit". Type "regedit" in the run field, navigate to the correct registry path based on your computer name, replace the last four characters with alphanumeric characters, and close the Registry Editor. Beware of using trial resetter programs or activating key files found online, as they can be malware that disables Kaspersky's protection and leaves your computer vulnerable.Kaspersky Software Trial Period Extension and Removal ===== Kaspersky's free Acrobat Reader does not have rasterizing capabilities. Many software companies offer a try-before-you-buy option, such as Kaspersky's 30-day trial period for its Anti-Virus, Internet Security, and Pure Total Security software. For users of Windows XP and above who need more time to decide, you can extend your trial period another 30 days. To reset the trial period after it ends, click the "Start" button at the bottom left corner of your computer screen. Depending on which edition of Windows you're using, select "Settings," then "Control Panel" and "System" if you're using the classic "Start" menu, or click "Control Panel," then "Performance or System and Maintenance" and "System" if you're using the modern "Start" menu. Take note of your Windows edition and the last 2 digits after the "x" in your computer name. For XP users, find the computer name underneath where it says "Registered to." Disconnect from the Internet and open your Kaspersky security program. Click the "License" link at the bottom, delete the expired license, and click "Close." Click "Settings" in the top right corner; then "Self-Defense" in the left column. Uncheck "Enable Self-Defense" on the right. Depending on which Kaspersky product you're using, you may have to click the "Advance Settings" tab first to see the Self-Defense options. Click "Apply" and "OK." Close the Kaspersky window, right-click the Kaspersky icon in the system tray at the bottom right of the screen and click "Exit." To remove the trial period from the software, you can use several effective methods, such as reinstalling the software and resetting time and date.reinstallation requires some flexibility with the date and time system. Adjusting this setting a few days before installation can help ensure continued functionality. ===== However, advanced programs may incorporate protection against such methods, leaving us with alternative approaches. Trial Stopper: A Tool for Removing Trial Periods from Software ===== Time Stopper is a program that makes expired applications believe they are still within their trial periods, but it doesn't allow direct execution of the test software. Instead, users can create a desktop shortcut with the new date and time to run the application. Trial-Reset 4.0 is capable of scanning and removing commercial protections from 45 types of software, including custom protectors like Reflexive and WinRAR. =====
