===== Using software homebrew on the Nintendo 3DS involves installing various formats, including CIA, 3DSX, NDS, and others. The most common way to install software is through the CIA format, which can be installed using either FBI or GodMode9 applications. For those preferring their applications on the HOME Menu, CIA format is recommended as it allows for easy installation and access. On the other hand, 3DSX format software can only be launched from the Homebrew Launcher, making it a better option for those who want more control over their homebrew experience. Another file format worth mentioning is NDS, which can be used with TWiLightMenu++/nds-bootstrap and DS flashcarts. Alternatively, creating a forwarder that points to the .nds file on your SD card can also be an effective way to install homebrew. It's essential to note that the 3DS HOME Menu has limitations - there's a limit of 300 3DS titles and 40 DSiWare titles. However, with tools like 3DSBank, it's possible to bypass these limits for 3DS titles. When working with various file formats, it's crucial to understand their uses and compatibility. For example, .3ds files are often used for cartridge dumps, while CXI files are used for digital file dumps/preservation. The APP format is also used in the Nintendo 3DS folder, but it's not easily manipulable. In summary, installing software on your 3DS requires knowledge of various formats and applications, including CIA, 3DSX, NDS, and others. Understanding how to use these tools and file formats effectively can help you unlock the full potential of your console. To start installing software, go to the Home Menu and select ****Available Downloads****. Choose a file with the .cia, .3dsx, or .nds extension, then press A to begin installation. Check the queue button to track progress. Once installed, exit the application by pressing Start. CIA files will appear in a gift box on your HOME Menu after exiting Universal-Updater. 3DSX files can be launched from Homebrew Launcher. NDS files require TWiLightMenu++ for launch. After installation, press Start to exit the application. If a CIA file doesn't immediately appear, try powering your console off and on. To run .3dsx format homebrew, place the file in the 3ds folder on your SD card. Some applications may need additional support files; refer to their README documentation if necessary. Navigate to Homebrew Launcher on your HOME Menu to access installed software. Use D-pad navigation and press A to launch applications. Reinstalling software from the eShop can be found here. Uninstalling software is described in 3DS:Uninstalling software. ===== To begin, navigate to your SD card and press A, then locate the .cia file you wish to install. Press A again to proceed to the CIA Image Options menu. From there, select Install game image and press A once more. If prompted, unlock write permissions by pressing A. Wait for the installation process to complete, then press Start to reboot your console. If you've also installed custom firmware on your 3DS, which may have introduced Universal-Updater, follow these additional steps. First, open the Universal-Updater application, recognizable by its blue down arrow icon. Use the D-Pad to navigate and the A button to select an application. Utilize the Search or Filter function to locate a specific title. Select either the .cia, .3dsx, or .nds file, then press A to initiate installation. After successful installation, check your HOME Menu for CIA files, which will appear in a gift box after exiting Universal-Updater. For 3DSX files, they will become available through the Homebrew Launcher application. NDS files, however, require launching from TWiLightMenu++. Once you've installed the .cia file and it does not immediately appear, try power cycling your console to resolve the issue. To run homebrew in .3dsx format, place your file within the 3ds folder on your SD card. Some applications may necessitate additional support files; refer to their README / documentation for further guidance. Homebrew should now be visible within the Homebrew Launcher. Navigate between applications using the D-Pad and press A to launch it. For software reinstalling, visit this page to redownload content from the 3DS eShop. Uninstallation details can be found in the 3DS:Uninstalling software section. ===== Installing CIAs on Nintendo 3DS without hacking the console is not possible.
